## KIAMBU COUNTY

### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

- Before the establishment of <u>colonial government</u> in Kiambu County, the hunter-gatherer Athi people settled in the area.
- The <u>Kikuyu</u> ethnic community settled in Kiambu County after the Athi people.
- Early settlers introduced a <u>policy</u> of land alienation.

## LOCATION

- Kiambu County is <u>located</u> in central Kenya.
- Kiambu County's total area measures 2,453.5 square kilometers.
- Kiambu County is divided into <u>four topographical zones</u>: Upper Highland, Lower Highland, the Upper Highland Zone and the Lower Midland Zone.

## POPULATION

- Kiambu County's population in 2019 was approximately 2.4 million.
- There are an <u>estimated 795,000 households</u> in Kiambu County.
- The <u>average household size</u> in Kiambu County is 3, lower than the Kenyan national average of 3.9 and tied for second lowest with Nyeri and Kirinyaga counties.
- Kiambu County's <u>population density in 2019</u> was 952 people per sq. km., the fourth largest of all Kenyan counties.
- 50.9% of Kiambu County's population is <u>female</u>.

## ECONOMY AND INDUSTRY

- 28% of Kiambu County's population has a secondary school <u>education level</u>, according to the 2009 census.
- 88% of <u>households</u> in Kiambu County have roofs made from corrugated iron sheets.
- 50% of <u>households</u> in Kiambu County have floors made from concrete.
- 48% of <u>households</u> in Kiambu County have walls made from stone.
- The <u>unemployment rate</u> in Kiambu County is 17%.

- Several <u>industries</u> are located in the Thika and Ruiru constituencies, including oil, vehicle, pharmaceutical and chemical companies.
- The Limuru constituency is home to the Bata Shoe Factory, one of Kenya's <u>largest leather</u> <u>product producers</u>.
- Agriculture is the <u>predominant industry</u> in Kiambu County.
- Coffee and tea are the county's <u>main cash crops</u>, while livestock farming is also a significant industry,

# HEALTH

- There are <u>108 health facilities</u> run by the Department of Health located in Kiambu County.
- Kiambu County has <u>24 health centers</u>, known as Tier 3 facilities, in Kenya's five tier system.
- There is one <u>level five hospital</u> in the county: Kiambu Level Five in Kiambu Town.
- The <u>doctor/population ratio</u> is 1:17,000.
- The <u>nurse/population ratio</u> is 1:1,300
- The average distance to a health facility in Kiambu County is seven kilometers.
- 45.3% of Kiambu County residents have <u>piped water</u>, about 1.5 times the average rate in Kenya.
- The <u>contraceptive prevalence rate</u> in Kiambu County is 74.1%.
- 93.4% of babies delivered in Kiambu County are <u>delivered</u> in a health facility.
- The <u>HIV prevalence rate</u> in Kiambu County is 5.6%, the sixth highest rate in Kenya.
- The majority of <u>new adult HIV</u> infections occur among people aged 15-24 years.
- The <u>fertility rate</u> in Kiambu County is 2.1.
- The average <u>life expectancy</u> for men is 62.8 and 63.6 for women.
- HIV/AIDS is the <u>leading cause of death</u> in Kiambu County, followed by stroke and tuberculosis.
- Malnutrition and unsafe sex are the <u>two largest risk factors</u> driving death and disability in Kiambu County.

## POLITICS

- Kiambu County adopted a new <u>constitution</u> in 2010.
- Like other counties in Kenya, Kiambu County operates a <u>devolved system</u> of government, whereby the governor is the executive authority in the county.
- James Karanja Nyoro is the <u>governor</u> of Kiambu County.
- Approximately 1.18 million people were <u>registered</u> to vote in Kiambu County in 2017.
- Kiambu County's <u>voting population</u> make up less than 10% of registered voters in Kenya.
