-MEJO 332.2 Public Relations Writing Final Exam-

For this exam, you are working as the public relations coordinator (congratulations! I hear it's a promotion – hope it pays well!) for Youth For Understanding USA, an international high school exchange student organization with an excellent reputation in global education. Although the organization has thrived for 70 years, it weathered two very discouraging years recently as a result of COVID-19-related mandates and international travel restrictions.

The organization is back on track and thriving again! It is extremely busy placing hundreds of eager students for the upcoming 2022-2023 academic year. Many are students who had to delay their student-exchange experience during the pandemic. This is great news; but, the organization is now in great need of more volunteers as soon as possible! The new exchange students will arrive this August! The communications director (your boss) tasks you with writing and formatting a strategic letter that will be mailed to current host families in the U.S. to help the organization spread the word about volunteer opportunities.

Your job is to equip the organization to communicate this message and call to action by creating a couple of communication tools that target its host families in the U.S. You may gather info about YFU USA and the domestic contacts from its website, <u>https://www.yfuusa.org/</u>. Here's what to do:

1. Write a direct mail letter that targets current host families in the U.S. (50% of final exam grade). Draft a <u>one- to two-page letter of appeal</u> to a specific host family (real or fictitious, your choice) that could be sent to all host families in the U.S. in a direct marketing campaign: (1) to thank them for their patience, support and response to COVID-19 emergency measures, (2) to encourage them to continue serving as host families next year and beyond, and (3) ---most important-- to share the urgent need for more volunteer support and to ask them to volunteer where needed and to help the organization spread the word in their communities and spheres of influence (<u>ways to volunteer, how to get involved</u>).

Use appropriate business letter format. <u>Write the letter for the YFU USA's current chair of the</u> <u>National Volunteer Council to sign</u> (you can find the chairperson's name and national organizational address on the website—About YFU > Leadership). Use a specific name or names and address for your recipient(s), even if the name(s) and address are fictitious. Show me that you learned all the best practices and key elements for an effective direct mail letter! Remember, this is <u>not content for email</u> or the website (hyperlinks aren't useful). <u>This is content intended for a traditional letter that will be</u> <u>mailed to the target audience by the U.S. Postal System.</u> (Be careful not to plagiarize any updates on the website. Use your own words and writing skills! Your honor is on the line!)

- 2. Select <u>one</u> additional public relations tool (50% of final exam grade) from the list below. Use correct format, good news judgment and strong strategy for the tool you select. Remember AP style!
 - a. <u>News Release</u> for one appropriate news outlet (print or broadcast outlet, traditional or digital format, your choice), or
 - b. <u>PSA</u> (60 seconds reading time; Consider the target audience and the call to action first), or
 - c. <u>Public Statement (aka: a three-minute speech)</u> for the chair of the National Volunteer Council to use in an upcoming Zoom meeting with U.S. host families. Please use correct speech format and strategic speech tactics.

You have approximately two days to complete your exam. Your completed work is due on Sakai no later than <u>5 p.m. EST Monday, May 2, 2022</u>. *I will subtract points for anything that arrives late*.

There may be errors in this information/memo – the common ones that you have grown to love throughout this semester. You will find the appropriate contact information through the YFU website. All AP style, grammar, spelling and punctuation errors count...you know the drill!

Be sure to consult your AP Stylebook, course textbook, dictionary, thesaurus, notes, graded writing assignments and format templates you may have. This exam is open-book, open-notes, but, please, do your work independently. **No teamwork, partnerships or collaborations on the exam.** Please check your work carefully before handing it in. Careless errors are deadly to final grades!

There will be no rewrites allowed for the final exam. All grades are final.

REMEMBER: Turn in your completed work on Sakai before the deadline. PROOFREAD YOUR WORK CAREFULLY.
